Request for Quotation For Construction of Watershed Structure

Through its BADILL project, Organization for Research and Community Development (ORCD) in cooperation with United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) is supporting local farmers in Zurmat district of Paktya province to enhance efficiency and effectiveness of the use of irrigation water. As part of this intervention, ORCD has provided Environmental and Social Safeguards training to the Operations & Maintenance Committee comprised of 30 volunteer community members. ORCD also intends to provide operations and maintenance training to the O&M committee and develop an annual work plan for O&M activities of the watershed structure to make sure the structure is maintained through community contribution in the mid to long term.

The overall goal of this endeavor is to diversify sources of livelihoods of target communities through extension of licit interventions to replace cultivation, processing, trafficking and business of narcotics and other types of illicit activities. As such, the local community members would be enabled to manage the available irrigation water effectively and efficiently which will allow them to cultivate and harvest wide range of vegetables, fruits, cereals and grains.

ORCD hereby invites interested and qualified Construction Companies to submit quotations for the construction of Watershed Structure according to the volume sheet of work.

Description of the Construction Work required:

The Service Provider is required to carry out site preparation, excavation, stone masonry, pointing, shuttering, PCC, patching and backfilling of 122 meters of wall.

Terms of Reference:

The construction company selected through Competitive Bidding process will need to carry out the following activities while strictly adhering to Environmental and Safeguards:

- Must deploy competent skilled labor to do construction work, preferably from locality
- Must hire unskilled labor including store keepers, guards, daily waged labor and etc. from locality
- Deploy a foreman for supervision of the construction work
- Cleanse the Karizes (the sources of springs)
- Supply crushed stone for stone masonry to the construction site
- Supply sand to the construction site
- Supply cement to the construction site
- Supply the required amount of gravel to the construction site
- Supply the required amount of river stone to the construction site for patching
- Supply the required amount of water to the construction site
- Provide all of the needed hand tools including pickaxes, shovels, wheel barrows, marter basins, trowels and etc.
- The hand tools provided by the supplier construction company must be handed over to the Operations and Maintenance Committee comprised of community volunteers
- Carry out site preparation including cleaning the site and 488 m³ excavation (122 m length, 2 m width and 2 m depth)
- Carry out foundation stone masonry (122 m length, 1.80 m width and 1 m height) 219.60 m³
- Carry out wall stone masonry (122 m length, 1.05 m width and 2.5 m height) 320.25 m³
- Carry out 446.15 m² pointing
- Carry out 24.40 m² Shuttering
- Carry out 24.40 m³ PCC concrete under foundation
- Carry out 7.32 m³ PCC concrete on top of the wall
- Carry out 29.38 m³ backfilling
- Prepare signboard for the Watershed Structure as per design provided by ORCD

Timeframe and Quality:

The supplier Construction Company is required to complete the construction of watershed structure within two months from signing the contract.

ORCD has assigned its Construction Engineer to oversee the construction work in the site to ensure:

- Environmental and Social Safeguards are implemented during construction work
- Laborers are over 18 years of age child labor in the construction work is avoided
- The construction work is according to the design
- Quality assurance of the work





Payment: the supplier will be paid the amount of contract in two equal installments upon successful completion of each milestone (construction of 109.80 meters of wall).

Tax payment: amount of 2% will be withheld from the total amount of contract by ORCD which will be paid to the MTO/MoF as per Afghanistan Tax Law. The vendor is also responsible to pay additional 2% to Ministry of Finance as tax.

Cancellation of RFQ: ORCD reserves the right for its own convenience and without charge or liability to cancel this RFQ process at any stage.

ORCD does not assume any obligations, liabilities or responsibilities related to the costs incurred by applicant firms in preparing their quotations and bid security bank letters, if the applicant company is disqualified due to not meeting the eligibility criteria or not recognized as winner due high prices provided.

Bid Opening Meeting:

The Bid Opening meeting will be held at ORCD Head Office on **20/June/2019** at 1000hrs. All eligible bidders who submit bids will be invited to participate.

ANNEX-II

ORCD Supplier Code of Conduct

ORCD expects its suppliers to fully adhere to the following principles and codes of conducts in the areas as mentioned below:

Labor:

- To recognize the freely-exercised right of workers, without distinction, to organize, further and defend their interests and to bargain collectively. Additionally, to protect those workers from any action or discrimination related to the exercise of their right to organize, to carry out trade union activities and to bargain collectively.
- To prohibit forced or compulsory labour in all its forms.
- Not to employ: a) children below 14 years of age or comply with the minimum age
 permitted by the law of the country of operations. b) Persons under the age of 18 for work
 that, by its nature or the circumstances in which it is carried out, is likely to harm the health,
 safety or morals of such persons.
- To ensure equality of opportunity and treatment in respect of employment and occupation without discrimination on grounds of race, colour, sex, religion, political opinion, national extraction or social origin and such other ground as may be recognized under the national law of the country of operations.
- To ensure the payment of wages in legal tender, at regular intervals no longer than one month, in full and directly to the workers concerned. Suppliers should keep an appropriate record of such payments. Deductions from wages are permitted only under conditions and to the extent prescribed by the applicable law, regulations or collective agreement, and suppliers should inform the workers concerned of such deductions at the time of each payment. The wages, hours of work and other conditions of work provided by suppliers should be not less favorable than the best conditions prevailing locally (i.e., as contained in: (i) collective agreements covering a substantial proportion of employers and workers; (ii) arbitration awards; or (iii) applicable laws or regulations), for work of the same character performed in the trade or industry concerned in the area where work is carried out).
- To ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, that: (a) the workplaces, machinery, equipment and processes under their control are safe and without risk to health; (b) the chemical, physical and biological substances and agents under their control are without risk to health when the appropriate measures of protection are taken; and (c) where necessary, adequate protective clothing and protective equipment are provided to prevent, so far as is reasonably practicable, risk of accidents or of adverse effects to health.

Human Rights:

- To support and respect the protection of internationally proclaimed human rights and to ensure that they are not complicit in human rights abuses.
- To create and maintain an environment that treats all employees with dignity and respect
 and will not use any threats of violence, sexual exploitation or abuse, verbal or psychological
 harassment or abuse. No harsh or inhumane treatment coercion or corporal punishment of
 any kind is tolerated, nor is there to be the threat of any such treatment.
- Not to engage in the sale or manufacture of anti-personnel mines or components utilized in the manufacture of anti-personnel mines.

Environment:

- To have an effective environmental policy and to comply with existing legislation and regulations regarding the protection of the environment. Suppliers should wherever possible support a precautionary approach to environmental matters, undertake initiatives to promote greater environmental responsibility and encourage the diffusion of environmentally friendly technologies implementing sound life-cycle practices.
- Chemical and other materials posing a hazard if released to the environment are to be identified and managed to ensure their safe handling, movement, storage, recycling or reuse and disposal.
- Wastewater and solid waste generated from operations, industrial processes and sanitation facilities are to be monitored, controlled and treated as required prior to discharge or disposal
- Air emissions of volatile organic chemicals, aerosols, corrosives, particulates, ozone depleting chemicals and combustion by-products generated from operations are to be characterized, monitored, controlled and treated as required prior to discharge or disposal.
- Waste of all types, including water and energy, are to be reduced or eliminated at the source or by practices such as modifying production, maintenance and facility processes, materials substitution, conservation, recycling and re-using materials.

Ethical conduct:

- To adhere to the highest standards of moral and ethical conduct, to respect local laws and not engage in any form of corrupt practices, including but not limited to extortion, fraud, or bribery.
- To disclose to ORCD any situation that may appear as a conflict of interest and ORCD official or professional under contract ORCD may have an interest of any kind in the supplier's business or any kind of economic ties with the supplier.
- ORCD has a "zero tolerance" policy and does not accept any type of gift or any offer of
 hospitality. ORCD will not accept any invitations to sporting or cultural events, offers of
 holidays or other recreational trips, transportation, or invitations to lunches or dinners.
 ORCD expects its suppliers not to offer any benefit such as free goods or services,
 employment or sales opportunity to an ORCD staff member in order to facilitate the
 suppliers' business with ORCD.
- Post-employment restrictions may apply to ORCD staff in service and former ORCD staff
 members who participated in the procurement process, if such persons had prior
 professional dealings with suppliers. ORCD suppliers are expected to refrain from offering
 employment to any such person for a period of one year following separation from service.

Applicants are requested to sign and stamp all pages of the quotations. Quotations with no signatures and stamps will be given zero consideration.
