

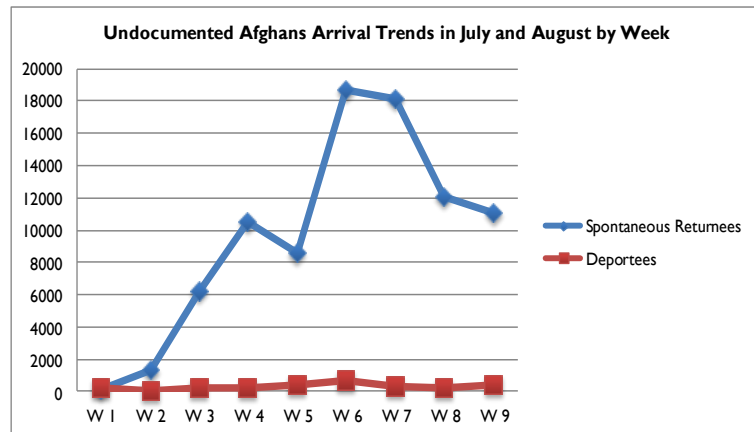
From 21-27 August, a total of **11,458** undocumented Afghans spontaneously returned or were deported from Pakistan through Nangarhar Province's Turkham border crossing according to the Border Monitoring Team of the Directorate of Refugees and Repatriation (DoRR). Out of the total, **11,065** were spontaneous returnees in family groups and **393** were deported individuals **including two families**.

The total number of returnees and deported Undocumented Afghans in W4 (11,458), represents a **41% decrease** in comparison with W1, a **38% decline** compared to W2 and a **7% drop** in comparison with W3. Anecdotal evidence related to the decrease points to a Government of Pakistan intervention ending police expulsions within KPK after demonstrations by the local population following negative economic fall out as a result of the departure of Afghans.

During W4, IOM assisted **1,966 (17%) Undocumented Afghans** from the total number of returnees through the Turkham crossing with post-arrival humanitarian assistance including refreshments, meals, special transportation for PSNs, NFIs for families, a one-month food ration from WFP and family and hygiene kits from UNICEF.

### Returnee Projections from August—December 2016:

The daily average return from 1-27 August stands at a combined **2,282** from Turkham and Spin Boldak crossings. If this trend continues, the total projection for August would be **70,736** and **353,681** for the remainder of 2016. The most vulnerable population from the total for the coming 5 months would equal **141,472** including August. As reported in W3, IOM can assist up to **29,400** individuals over the coming 5 months at current funding levels.



### Partners Assisting Returnees in IOM Transit Center:

**WFP:** from 1—27 August WFP provided one-month food ration to 793 families (5,551 members) in addition to those 337 families that have received the full package of post-arrival assistance from IOM which also includes a one-month food ration.

**UNICEF:** provided 800 families (5,600 members) with Emergency Family Kits, that include; bed nets, tarpaulins and jerry cans.

**WHO:** provided the IOM Transit Center Clinic with emergency medical kits and essential medicines for 1,000 individuals.
